Congratulations to the 20 Federated States of Micronesia (#FSM) health workers and assistants who today finish their training course by [Chuuk Women's Council's](#) Tongen Inepwineu Counseling Center ([Ticc Gbv](#)) for 'Gender, Violence Against Women, Human Rights, Psychological First Aid and Frontline Support.'

[Chuuk Women's Council](#), states: 'The training's focus is on FSM health assistants and increasing their knowledge about the many aspects of support needed for survivors of violence against women - beyond medical assistance to include support to recover and seek long term assistance.'

The Psychological First Aid and Gender-Based Violence (GBV) training is being held this week from 5-9 July, at the Truk Stop Hotel in Chuuk, FSM.

The Tongen Inepwineu Counseling Center ([Ticc Gbv](#)) staff will be training alongside the women and men health assistant trainees from the neighboring islands of Chuuk on how to provide better support to women and girl survivors of violence.

For the health assistants, this will help them pave the way for health services in rural locations to provide more comprehensive, necessary services for survivors. It will also support their work as first responders in close collaboration with [Ticc Gbv](#) to ensure better support to survivors.

Altogether, they will all learn how to properly handle referrals to ensure women and girl survivors receive all the treatment and support they need to recover from the violence. Thanks to collaborative efforts between [Chuuk Women's Council](#), [Pacific Women](#) and the [IOM - UN Migration](#).
